

OCA Case Explanation


- Inquiries to the OCA include phone calls, emails, and cases opened from in-person meetings with children, providers, and stakeholders.

Nashua Children's Home (NCH)


- NCH is a level 2 program which indicates that children placed there should have lower-level acuity and therapeutic needs. The milieu staff ratio is 1:4.
- Quiet room data was presented previously, and the use of the room was discussed at the last meeting. OCA requested this information from BCBH and DCYF Bureau of Evaluation, Analytics and Reporting (BEAR). We are working collaboratively to determine how to ensure the OCA can receive this information regularly.

Spaulding Academy and Family Services (Spaulding)


- Spaulding restraints include all programs; Spaulding has one level 2 program and three level 3 programs. At this time the OCA does not have the ability to separate out data for each program given the format in which reports are shared and the limitations of our Case Management System (CMS).
- Last month, per a Spaulding Academy data report, the level 2 program accounted for 0 restraints, the Medically Intensive program accounted for 0 restraints, the Neurobehavioral Intensive program accounted for 23 restraints, and the Intensive program accounted for 14 restraints. This report was not received for October. The OCA has outreached to ensure we get a copy.


Whitney Academy (Whitney)

- Whitney is a level 3 intensive program which indicates that children placed there have higher therapeutic needs and require additional supports and higher-level supervision. The milieu staff ratio is 1:2.
- Although Whitney Academy is located in Massachusetts, we receive all restraint and seclusion reports for any program that NH DCYF places children in. The above restraint data is specific to NH children.



Sununu Youth Services Center (SYSC)

- The OCA has requested for SYSC to share their definitions of the incident types. They are currently revising the Behavioral Management Guide which includes definitions of each incident. The OCA will share once completed.
- The OCA engages in monthly meetings with the psychologist at SYSC to check in on specific children and discuss clinical offerings. There have been additional clinical groups offered.
- I met with the Director of the facility to discuss OCAs recommendations for activities to further engage the children and help reduce the restlessness that leads to acting out behaviors. He was very receptive to these recommendations.
- The OCA will be on site at SYSC later this afternoon to engage in an activity and join the kids and staff for pizza.
