

Restraint & Seclusion Explanation

- This data includes all residential facilities which the OCA receives restraint and seclusion reports from.
- The OCA only receives restraint and seclusion reports from contracted facilities; we do not receive them for certified-only facilities, including many of the out-of-state facilities beyond the New England region.
- Although we have made multiple attempts to receive ALL restraint and seclusion reports via the DCYF reporting email, they have been unsuccessful, so we will be sending a letter to each residential facility certified by the State to inform on our statute and the reporting we need to begin receiving regularly.




